Ohio Department of Developmental Disabilities-

Waivers and Other Services

The Individual Options Waiver (IO Waiver) is for people with mental retardation or developmental disabilities who meet the waiver's eligibility requirements. Services provided through this waiver allow people to stay in their homes and get support rather than living in an Intermediate Care Facility (ICF/MR). This waiver is administered by DODD.

The Level 1 Waiver is for people with mental retardation or developmental disabilities who meet the waiver's eligibility requirements. Services provided through this waiver allow people to stay in their homes and get support rather than living in an Intermediate Care Facility (ICF/MR). This waiver is administered by DODD. Each year you can use any combination of Homemaker/Personal Care, Informal Respite, Institutional Respite, or Transportation, up to a combined total of \$5000. Steps to follow:

1. Contact local Board of DD, ask to be assigned a case manager/ service coordinator/ service and supports administrator
2. Request applications for Individual Options Waiver program and Level I Waiver program.
3. Request to be placed on IO & Level I waiver waiting lists. *IO waiver may not be accepting new candidates.
4. Request information on any financial assistance in which you are eligible.
